IMPLEMENTING AGENCY

Mao Students' Union, in coordination with local authorities and community stakeholders.

BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATION

The Inner Line Permit (ILP) system is a statutory mechanism intended to regulate the entry and stay of non-indigenous persons in protected areas in order to safeguard indigenous land, culture, identity, and demographic balance.

In view of increasing movement of non-locals into Mao areas and reports of ILP violations, the Mao Students' Union undertook an ILP Exercise to assist the administration in monitoring compliance, verifying documents, and creating public awareness regarding ILP regulations.

OBJECTIVES OF THE ILP EXERCISE

To verify ILP documents of non-locals residing and working in Mao areas.

To identify persons staying without valid ILP.

To assist in effective enforcement of ILP regulations.

To generate data for administrative reference and policy planning.

To create awareness among non-locals and local residents regarding ILP compliance.

METHODOLOGY ADOPTED

Formation of field teams consisting of MSU executives and volunteers

Setting up temporary checkpoints and survey points

Two offices are set up at Mao-Gate and Tadubi

Collection of basic demographic, occupational, and ILP-status data

Awareness interaction with non-local residents

OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

A significant number of non-locals were found without valid ILP documents.

Labourers and students constituted the majority of non-local population.

Migrant influx from Bihar and Uttar Pradesh was comparatively higher.

There is a need for regular monitoring and stricter enforcement of ILP provisions.

Creation of a verified database of non-local residents

Identification of ILP defaulters for administrative follow-up

Increased awareness regarding ILP compliance

Strengthened cooperation between civil society and administration
